All other awards/aid from Northwestern/scholarships that the student receives shall be applied to the student's account first. Students who apply Early Decision have a better chance at admission.

- Must be a graduate of Grand Island Senior High
- Must have attended Grand Island Senior High for at least two years
- Well-rounded candidates with demonstrated academic, athletic, performing arts or community service accomplishments
- Need to be admitted to Northwestern through the normal admittance procedures
- Must upload Northwestern financial aid estimate
- An ideal candidate would be one for whom Northwestern University is his/her dream school and financial considerations are a barrier to attendance.

Selection Procedure

Applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee appointed by the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation.

Terms of Payment

The scholarship will be paid through the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation to Northwestern University per scholarship eligibility defined above. The student must provide proof of enrollment (class schedule), student number and a tuition bill to the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation for scholarship distribution each term.

Terms of Renewal

The scholarship is for four years assuming the candidate maintains a 2.5 (out of 4.0) or equivalent grade point average for the preceding year.
