Born in 1915, Irma Louise Nichols surrounded herself with music and theater through her high school years. At age 16, young Irma played the part of "Pat" in the show The Wild Oats Boy by Lillian Mortimer. Though the show was short-lived, the nickname was not. From then forward she was called Pat. She became an accomplished pianist and church organist, a career that spanned 50 years. Pat enjoyed countless concert and theater performances her entire 102 years of life.

Pat could not go to college because of the Great Depression. It is her family's wish to help provide an opportunity for young people to fulfill their college dreams. This scholarship is designed to carry on Pat's musical legacy for students who pursue music as an avocation or career.

The Irma Louise "Pat" Nichols Memorial Scholarship is a part of the Grand Island Concert Association Scholarships. In the spirit of encouraging musical and theatrical talent, the GICA offers scholarships annually to area students who have a plan to continue to grow and use their gifts.

# **Eligibility**

- Must be a graduate of one of the following high schools:

  Cecilia, Heartland Community High School, Loup City, Ord, Palmer, High Plains, Ravenna, Shelton, St. Paul,
  Wood River, York, Nebraska Christian, Aurora, Central City, Central Valley, Centura, Doniphan-Trumbull,
  Elba, Fullerton, Hampton, Hastings, or Adams Central.
- Must be involved in music, musical theater or musical performance in school and/or in the community
- Student must upload a 1 minute audio file showing proficiency in voice or instrument. (Theater students upload a monologue or reading).
- Must attend an accredited trade school, university, or college

- Give a brief synopsis of your involvement in school and community music and/or theater activities. (Max 500 words)
- What are your dreams for using your talent in music and/or theater 10 years from now? Tell us how you plan to continue to develop your interest and talent. (Max 500 words)

### **Selection Procedure**

Applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee appointed by the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation.

#### **Terms of Payment**

Scholarships larger than \$500 will be split into equal semester payments. The student must provide proof of enrollment (class schedule) and student number to the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation for scholarship distribution.
