



Selection Procedure

Applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee appointed by the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation.

Terms of Payment

The scholarship will be paid through the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation to appropriate educational institution per scholarship eligibility defined above. Scholarships larger than \$500 will be split into equal semester payments. The student must provide proof of enrollment (class schedule) and student number to the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation for scholarship distribution. Proof of enrollment is needed for each semester covered by scholarship terms.




- How you complete your application is very important

- The application system will filter student applications into all the scholarship reviews the student qualifies for based on how the student answers questions








What do the icons mean?

Icons represent the status of each document








What do the icons mean?

all required fields complete optional fields not complete






What do the icons mean?

Icons represent the status of each document


Red exclamation point at least one required field must be completed before you can submit

- Or enter whatever your situation may be





Personal Essay Questions

Personal Narrative

The best personal statements describe strengths and achievements in an intimate and unique way, capitalizing on life experiences which have molded you into a worth candidate. Let the selection committee know who you are through your writing. (Max 500 words)

Personal and Career Goals

What are your personal and career goals? What is your plan for achieving these goals? (Max 500 words)

Financial Plan

Attending college can be expensive. What is your financial plan for achieving this goal? (Max 500 words)

Do NOT use your name

DO NOT USE YOUR NAME IN THE ESSAYS. If you use your name, the Scholarship Committee reserves the right to disqualify your application.

We suggest you use the GIPS Foundation Writing Rubric to guide your writing.

NOTE: Proof your essays before you submit your application. When you paste essays from other sources, some characters may not import correctly.

Bob Hamblet Northwestern University Scholarship

ligibility

- * Must be a graduate of Grand Island Senior Highand attended Grand Island Senior High for at least two years
- * Well-rounded candidates with demonstrated academic, athletic, performing arts or community service accomplishments
 - * Need to be admitted to Northwestern through the normal admittance procedures
 - * Must upload Northwestern financial aid estimate
- * An ideal candidate would be one for whom Northwestern University is his/her dream school and financial considerations are a barrier to attendance

NOTE: To be considered for this scholarship your application MUST be submitted on or before January 19, 2022

If you are applying for the Bob Hamblet Northwestern University Scholarship, tell us why you want to attend Northwestern University.

(Max 500 words)

American Legion Post 53 Scholarship

Eligibility

- * Must be a graduate of Grand Island Senior High, Grand Island Northwest, Grand Island Central Catholic, Heartland Lutheran, or Home schooled in the Grand Island Area
 - * This Scholarship is for high school seniors and graduates who are currently in their first or second year of college
 - * Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA
 - * Must have a connection to a United States veteran
 - * Must attend an accredited trade school, university, or college

Submit a short statement explaining your connection to a United States veteran and how has this connection made a positive impact on you?

Important Application Dates

- December 1, 2023 Application open
- February 7, 2024 Application closed
- Late March 2024 Scholarship offer letters sent
 Complete the form IMMEDIATELY
- Early April 2024 Alternate offer letters sent*
 If a first scholarship offer is declined, an alternate offer is sent
