

Selection Procedure

Applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee appointed by the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation.

Terms of Payment

The scholarship will be paid through the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation to appropriate educational institution per scholarship eligibility defined above. Scholarships larger than \$500 will be split into equal semester payments. The student must provide proof of enrollment (class schedule) and student number to the Grand Island Public Schools Foundation for scholarship distribution. Proof of enrollment is needed for each semester covered by scholarship terms.

The best personal statements describe strengths and achievements in an intimate and unique way, capitalizing on life experiences which have molded you into a worth candidate. Let the selection committee know who you are through your writing. (Max 500 words)

Personal and Career Goals

What are your personal and career goals? What is your plan for achieving these goals? (Max 500 words)

Financial Plan

Attending college can be expensive. What is your financial plan for achieving this goal? (Max 500 words)

Do NOT use your name

Fligibility

* Must be a graduate of Grand Island Senior Highand attended Grand Island Senior High for at least two years

* Well-rounded candidates with demonstrated academic, athletic, performing arts or community service accomplishments

* Need to be admitted to Northwestern through the normal admittance procedures

* Must upload Northwestern financial aid estimate

* An ideal candidate would be one for whom Northwestern University is his/her dream school and financial considerations are a barrier to attendance

NOTE: To be considered for this scholarship your application MUST be submitted on or before January 20, 2021


GIPS Foundation Essay Tips

Don't be tempted to use the same essay over, and over, and over...




Get organized

- Create a Google folder for scholarship information







Icons represent the status of each document








What do the icons mean?

all required fields complete optional fields not complete






What do the icons mean?

Review Process

- Scholarship Review Committee DOES NOT have access to your contact information
- DO NOT use your name when completing essay questions
- How you complete your application is very important
- The Application System will filter student applications into all the Scholarship reviews the student qualifies for based on how the student answers questions
