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




## Where Donations Come From

### Supporting students in achieving their dreams and goals



## Wild About Monsters

Thanks to a GIPS Foundation Classroom Grant, students at Newell and Lincoln Elementary Schools brought their imaginations to life by creating clay monsters inspired by the book “Where the Wild Things Are.” Over 535 kindergarten through fifth-grade students participated in this hands-on project, led by artist-in-residence Nancy Fairbanks. Fairbanks taught students about clay and guided them through the process of working with it, encouraging creativity and self-expression as they crafted their own unique monsters.

This project “supports our Positive Supports goal, offering a meaningful outlet for creativity in the classroom,” said Principal Nate Balcom. By connecting literature with art, the activity not only enriched students’ learning but also provided a fun and engaging way to foster self-confidence and collaboration in a supportive environment.

## GISH School Store Gets Creative with New DTF Printer

Thanks to a GIPS Foundation Classroom Grant, students at Grand Island Senior High are transforming from consumers to creators. The grant funded a Direct-to-Film (DTF) printer, allowing the Academy of Business and Communications and the student-run School Store to produce custom apparel and gear on demand.



Previously, the store relied on external vendors, resulting in high costs and long wait times.


Now, students can print designs for less than 20 cents each, enabling them to sell T-shirts for as low as \$10. This hands-on experience teaches students to manage the entire business cycle—from consulting with customers like Islander Robotics to launching their own small businesses.

Most importantly, every sale is an investment. All proceeds are funneled back into student projects within the Academy, ensuring a sustainable cycle of learning. By bridging the gap between classroom theory and retail reality, the GIPS Foundation is helping students create, sell, and succeed—one design at a time.




## Harvest Evening of joy, gratitude, celebrating success and raising funds

## **Giving Every Student a Voice**

At Starr Elementary, second-grader Alex is a vibrant student with a diagnosis of Autism. Like many students, Alex's journey included the challenge of limited verbal communication, a barrier that made it difficult for him to fully participate and express his bright personality. Before receiving his grant-funded communication device, his verbal output was limited, often resulting in short phrases like, "yes, blue." When frustration mounted, his inability to communicate led to challenging behaviors.

Thanks to a Compassion Grant from the Embree "Em" Learned Memorial Fund, Alex received a device that is nothing short of transformative. This technology is his pathway to independence and social connection, empowering him to spontaneously share his thoughts and needs. The change has been profound.

This device isn't just equipment; it's a voice. It has allowed Alex to integrate fully into his classroom environment and continue on a positive trajectory of growth and development.
